## PRELIMINARY RUNNING ORDER

**All Handler Discrimination runs will run before all Buried runs.** This will ensure that the non-odor classes run before any odor is introduced to the search areas.

**Trial 1 Handler Discrimination** will start at 9:00 am and run Novice through Excellent.

**Trial 2 Handler Discrimination** will start at 9:30 am and run Novice through Excellent.

**Trial 1 Buried** will start after all Handler Discrimination runs are finished and run Novice through Master.

**Trial 2 Buried** will start after all Handler Discrimination runs are finished and run Novice through Master.

**Conflicts** will be handled on an individual basis. If your dog(s) are entered in elements that are running at the same time, please inform the gate steward.

**Move-up deadline** is Wednesday, June 5, 2024, at 5:00 pm. Move-ups will be allowed between trials. Move ups must be submitted prior to the beginning of the same class in the next trial.

## DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), or an AKC Canine Partners listing number. Approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate. Aggressive dogs or dogs suffering from an injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental

performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

### WAIT LIST / LOAD BALANCING / SUBSTITUTIONS

**Wait List:** The Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date. All pre-entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the trial secretary prior to the closing date (as listed on the first page of this premium) at the trial secretary's address. No entries may be withdrawn for a refund after the closing date unless the withdrawn entry is replaced by a waitlisted entry.

**Load Balancing:** After closing, the judge assignments may be changed for load balancing, as each judge cannot exceed 125 runs per day. If a judge assignment changes, exhibitors have the right to request a full refund of their entry fee for any classes affected (AKC Scent Work Regulations, Chapter 3, Section 24). Load balancing may mean that wait listed runs may be adjusted and moved into full runs after closing. Anyone who wishes to pull for a refund **MUST** do so before the closing date, even if their run(s) are wait listed. Any waitlisted entry that does not move off the waitlist and into the trial will receive a full refund. Refunds will be sent out after the trial is over.

**Substitutions:** Substitutions will be allowed on a limited basis. If an entered dog has a behavioral issue or medical emergency, the owner may substitute another dog owned by the same owner into those runs **ONLY** if the other dog is already entered in the trial.

### CRATING, STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UPS

**Crating** will be in competitors' cars. More information will be provided in the final email confirmation.

The **Staging Area** will be out of view of the search area(s). The Staging Area will include a warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

**A General Briefing** will take place in the morning before the first dog runs.

A **Warm-up Area** will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blank containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior to their run, or for recovery after the run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

A **Dog-relief Area** will be described during check-in and the handler briefing. Handlers should limit where their dog(s) relieve themselves to this area. Dogs should not relieve themselves on any man-made structure or anything likely to be touched by people.

### SEARCH AREA INFORMATION

Searches will be indoors and outdoors. Outdoor searches may be on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Walk throughs will be provided before each element so handlers will be able to see the search areas.

Search areas, potty areas, and walking paths might include uneven ground or changes in elevation and might be located a distance from the competitor waiting area.

### EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

## **SAFETY, BEHAVIOR, and LIABILITY**

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such cases, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

**The safety of the dog is our primary concern.** By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. The Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah (BNSWCU) and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assume no responsibility for injury to children. BNSWCU reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah or any official thereof.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendations to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

**Collars, Leashes and Harnesses.** During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material. All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

**Trial Site.** It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

**Possession of Odors and Training.** Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area."

**Spectators.** Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

**Exhibitors are responsible** for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

**Assisting:** No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge, AND THE ENTRANT WILL RECEIVE A NON-QUALIFYING SCORE. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

**Videoing:** If you are found to upload videos of your search to social media before your element/level is complete, you will be reported to the AKC for the violation.

## REFUNDS

*If you are feeling ill and think you may have contracted COVID-19, your entry fees will be refunded, minus the \$3.50 AKC processing fee.* You must notify the secretary no later than the night before to receive a refund. In all other cases: no entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical conditions are not eligible for a refund. Bitches in season will be refunded entry fees less the AKC processing fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

## RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

**Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered.**

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the official AKC Entry Form for this event.

Multiple dogs from the same owner may be entered in the same class/level, provided they are run by different handlers. Dogs entering the Advanced, Excellent, Master or Detective classes must have earned the required title, as stipulated in the AKC Scent Work Regulations.
