Envelopes/transactions containing entries for more than the ten (10) dog maximum and/or entries received prior to the opening date shall be treated as an invalid entry and shall be returned to the sender. Day of show entries will not be accepted at this trial.

All Days: The general briefing will be at 8:45 am with first dog to follow. Elements, HD, and Detective running order will be announced in the final email confirmation.

Conflicts will be handled on an individual basis. If your dog(s) are entered in elements that are running at the same time, please inform the gate steward.

Move-up deadline is Wednesday, March 27, 2024, at 5:00 pm. Move-ups must be received in writing by the Trial Secretary no later than 30 minutes after the last dog finishes on the day before.

REMIND TEXT NOTIFICATIONS

We plan on using Remind to notify competitors of what classes are coming up. Remind is a free app that lets us send texts to everyone who has subscribed. This will allow us to inform competitors which elements and levels will be doing walk throughs and when the classes are preparing to run. DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), or an AKC Canine Partners listing number. Approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate. Aggressive dogs or dogs suffering from an injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

WAIT LIST / LOAD BALANCING / SUBSTITUTIONS

Wait List: The Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date. All pre-entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the trial secretary prior to the closing date (as listed on the first page of this premium) at the trial secretary's address. No entries may be withdrawn for a refund after the closing date unless the withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry.

Load Balancing: After closing, the judge assignments may be changed for load balancing, as each judge cannot exceed 125 runs per day. If a judge assignment changes, exhibitors have the right to request a full refund of their entry fee for any classes affected (AKC Scent Work Regulations, Chapter 3, Section 24). Load balancing may mean that wait listed runs may be adjusted and moved into full runs after closing. Anyone who wishes to pull for a refund **MUST** do so before the closing date, even if their run(s) are wait listed. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list and into the trial will receive a full refund. Refunds will be sent out after the trial is over.

Substitutions: Substitutions will be allowed on a limited basis. If an entered dog has a behavioral issue or medical emergency, the owner may substitute another dog into those runs **ONLY** if the other dog is already entered in the trial.

CRATING, STAGING AREA, AND WARM-UPS

Crating will be available in a heated building with a concrete floor. Please bring a mat to lay under your setup. More information will be provided in the final email confirmation.

The **Staging Area** will be out of view of the search area(s). The Staging Area will include a warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

A **Warm-up Area** will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blank containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior to their run, or for recovery after the run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

A **Dog-relief Area** will be described during check-in and the handler briefing. Handlers should limit where their dog(s) relieve themselves to this area. Dogs should not relieve themselves on any man-made structure or anything likely to be touched by people.

SEARCH AREA INFORMATION

Searches will be indoors and outdoors. Outdoor searches may be on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces.

Search areas, potty areas, and walking paths might include uneven ground or changes in elevation and might be located a distance from the competitor's waiting area.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR, and LIABILITY

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such cases, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. The Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah (BNSWCU) and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assume no responsibility for injury to children. BNSWCU reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Bristle Nose Scent Work Club of Utah or any official thereof.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendations to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Collars, Leashes, and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material. All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state: "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any of the target odors when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than in the designated warm-up area."

Spectators. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without the benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Assisting: No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge, AND THE ENTRANT WILL RECEIVE A NON-QUALIFYING SCORE. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

Videoring: If you are found to upload videos of your search to social media before your element/level is complete, you will be reported to the AKC for the violation.

REFUNDS

If you are feeling ill and think you may have contracted COVID-19, your entry fees will be refunded, minus the \$3.50 AKC processing fee. You must notify the secretary no later than the night before to receive a refund. In all other cases, no entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical conditions are not eligible for a refund. Bitches in season will be refunded entry fees less the AKC processing fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than 5:00 pm the day before the start of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

VENDORS

There will be no food or beverages for sale on the trial grounds. There are restaurants within a short driving distance of the venue. Commercial sales may be allowed on the show grounds during the weekend. Please contact the trial committee for more information.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim of loss, injury or damage to this dog.

Entrants are responsible to be familiar with AKC Scent Work rules. Novice A Classes are open to dogs who have not completed any title for that particular element, who have not completed a comparable title with another organization, and who have never worked as professional detection dogs. Novice B classes are open to all dogs. Dogs may enter multiple dogs in different levels within each element (with the exception of Handler Discrimination), at each trial. Multiple dogs from the same owner may be entered in the same class/level, provided they are run by different handlers. Dogs entering the Advanced, Excellent, Master or Detective classes must have earned the required title, as stipulated in the AKC Scent Work Regulations. To be eligible for the High in Trial award you must be entered in all elements (Interior, Exterior, Interior, and Containers), in the same class, for that trial.
